**Sub Culture** | With "The Audience and the Eavesdropper: New Art From India and Pakistan," **Phillips de Pury & Co.** is spotlighting talent rarely seen outside the subcontinent. The selling exhibition, which runs from January 20 through February 14 in New York following its London showing, is the first the house has devoted to this category and comprises works by 10 artists.

Phillips's **Veronica Collins**, who organized the exhibition with New Delhi's **Nature Morte** gallery, wanted to focus on talents "who are doing something different" from miniature painting, which centuries after its Mughal-era heyday remains the craft of choice of artists in India and Pakistan.

*Jiten Thukral and Sumir Tagra's Now in Your Neighborhood, 2008.*

One featured work is the Lahore-based **Rashid Rana's** *Desperately Seeking Paradise*, 2007-08, an enormous stainless-steel cube plastered with photos of contemporary Lahore. Another highlight is the designer/artist duo **Jiten Thukral and Sumir Tagra's** *Now in Your Neighborhood*, 2008, a 28-foot-long pink dinosaur made of plastic bottles.

Prices range from \$4,000 to \$360,000.
