ASPEN ART MUSEUM ANNOUNCES 2011 artCRUSH ANNUAL SUMMER BENEFIT, WED, AUG 3 – FRI, AUG 5; ACCLAIMED AMERICAN ARTIST RONI HORN HONORED AS ASPEN AWARD FOR ART RECIPIENT

350+ top collectors, wine connoisseurs, artists, gallery owners, and international guests expected for 7th annual AAM gala weekend.

Concurrent summer exhibitions feature Jane and Marc Nathanson Distinguished Artist Haegue Yang and legendary American photographer Stephen Shore; On View July 29 – Oct 9, 2011.

ASPEN, CO—The Aspen Art Museum announces its 7th annual **artCRUSH** summer benefit gala to be held Friday, August 5, 2011 as preceded by accompanying festivities: wineCRUSH and previewCRUSH, for three days of art, wine, and philanthropy in Aspen. Over 350 of the world's top art collectors, wine connoisseurs, artists, gallery owners, curators, celebrities, and global business leaders come together in Aspen each summer for the AAM's benefit weekend.

artCRUSH 2011 will feature the presentation of the 2011 Aspen Award for Art to renowned American artist **Roni Horn**, who will also donate a work for the evening's live auction. The event is chaired by veteran Chair and AAM National Council member **Amy Phelan** and, for the 5th consecutive year, the AAM partners with presenting sponsor Sotheby's, whose Principal Auctioneer and Worldwide Head of Contemporary Art **Tobias Meyer** will once again preside over the evening's live auction. In 2010, the **artCRUSH** benefit weekend garnered an overall record-setting \$1.5 million in support of the AAM's groundbreaking contemporary visual arts programming.

In addition to the main **artCRUSH** event, related evening events precede the gala including: **wineCRUSH**, (Wednesday, August 3, 2011)—a remarkable evening of wine and food hosted by John and Amy Phelan in their Aspen home during which master sommeliers guide guests through rare vintages and pairings, and featuring the Phelan's cutting-edge art collection; and, **previewCRUSH**, (Thursday, August 4, 2011)—a cocktail reception and artCRUSH live auction preview at Aspen's Baldwin Gallery.

afterpartyCRUSH will once again take place post-main event at Aspen's popular Syzygy/Ute City restaurant locations, featuring acclaimed celebrity DJ Samantha Ronson. Ronson has spun at some of the most high profile gigs around the country— Jessica Simpson's birthday party; with Lindsay Lohan on the American Music Awards; parties and events for *ElleGirl* Prom, *Blender, Maxim*, the IFC Awards, Playstation at the Super Bowl, Sundance, the VMA's in Miami, and more.

RONI HORN—2011 ASPEN AWARD FOR ART HONOREE

Born in New York in 1955, Roni Horn received her MFA from Yale University in 1978. She currently lives and works both in New York and in Reykjavik, Iceland. Her work is included in many private and public collections around the globe. On view in the AAM Lower Gallery during the gala celebrations will be the 2011 **Jane and Marc Nathanson Distinguished Artist in Residence** exhibition of renowned Korean-born artist **Haegue Yang**. This, Yang's first solo U.S. museum exhibition, the artist will include a new series of light sculptures that feature clothing display racks, mountain river driftwood and pinecones, among other natural and manmade objects. Also on view concurrently from July 29 – October 9, 2011 in the museum's Upper Gallery is an exhibition by renowned American photographer **Stephen Shore**. Featuring 36 images from a never-before-seen photographic series portraying Abu Dhabi, this AAM exhibition gives U.S. audiences a street-level view of the region that is refreshingly free from media inflection or exaggeration.
