Featuring six new commissions by 2006 HUGO BOSS Prize nominees Allora & Calzadilla

New York/Metzingen, April 6, 2011. HUGO BOSS will serve as the major sponsor for the U.S. Pavilion at the Venice Biennale, the 54th International Art Exhibition, which will be on view from June 4 through November 27, 2011. The prize is given to an artist whose work represents a significant development in contemporary art.

Working together since 1995, Jennifer Allora (b. 1974, Philadelphia, Pennsylvania) and Guillermo Calzadilla (b. 1971, Havana, Cuba) are a collaborative that lives and works in San Juan, Puerto Rico. Allora & Calzadilla create works that blend sculpture, photography, performance, sound, and video. Their work has been featured in solo exhibitions internationally, including at MoMA, New York (2010), Kunstmuseum Krefeld, Museum Haus Esters, Krefeld, (2009), Haus der Kunst in Munich, Germany (2008), Serpentine Gallery and Whitechapel Art Gallery in London (2007), Palais de Tokyo in Paris (2006), Stedelijk Museum in Amsterdam (2008), Kunsthalle Zürich in Zürich, Switzerland (2007), National Museum of Art in Oslo, Norway (2009), and the Renaissance Society in Chicago (2007) among others.
