Art Film | Program Details:

'The Host and the Cloud' | 2009/2010 | by Pierre Huyghe | Running Time 122' | Marian Goodman Gallery | Selected by Marc Glöde

In 'The Host and the Cloud' Pierre Huyghe transforms a Parisian museum into an experimental theater stage. The museum becomes a site for varied activities: It serves as a courtroom, meeting place, nightclub, and laboratory. Only the empty display cases recall the original function of the museum, where sculptures and pictures used to be presented. This film is Huyghe's trenchant way of questioning the role that museums and exhibitions play today.

'Resensitization' | Running Time 60' | Curated by Marc Glöde

All the works in this program present film as a medium that is experienced through the senses. In an illuminating dialog, the selected films address cinematic 'Resensitization,' both in the form of one's own sensual perception of the films as a viewer and of the sensual exploration of the films themselves.

In 'All Divided Selves,' Fowler produces a uniquely individual collage interweaving archival footage of Glaswegian psychiatrist R.D. Laing with his own filmic material, photographs, interviews, diagrams, and writings.

'Marina Abramović: The Artist Is Present' by Matthew Akers | 2011 | Running Time 106' | Selected by This Brunner

This documentary film accompanies Marina Abramović prior to, during, and after her extensive 2010 MoMA exhibition 'The Artist Is Present'. For the entire duration of the exhibition, Abramović spent six days a week sitting motionless on a chair in the middle of the museum's atrium. One by one, visitors had the opportunity to sit opposite the artist. The film offers an intimate look behind the scenes and observes Marina Abramović's interactions with her audience, curators, gallerists and students.
