Theater Basel and Art Basel to present the Swiss premiere of Douglas Gordon's 'Bound to Hurt' this June

Art Basel, in collaboration with Theater Basel, is delighted to announce the Swiss premiere of musical theater 'Bound to Hurt', which will be staged in Basel from June, 16 – 18, 2016. 'Bound to Hurt' is a collaboration between Laura Berman, Opera Director at Theater Basel; the artist Douglas Gordon; the performer and soprano Ruth Rosenfeld; British composer Philip Venables and the German-Icelandic Ensemble Adapter.

Turner Prize-winning artist **Douglas Gordon** stages a dark musical performance exploring the sensitive topic of domestic violence. Using a compilation of popular cover songs as its basis, Gordon, one of the world's most influential video and installation artists, has developed this stage work in collaboration with British composer **Philip Venables**. In 'Bound to Hurt' songs by artists as diverse as Donna Summer, Jacques Brel, alongside more experimental music by Throbbing Gristle, are reimagined as surreal fantasies of violence. The musical score is written especially for the extremely versatile singer and performer **Ruth Rosenfeld**, best-known for her collaborations with theatre directors Frank Castorf and Herbert Fritsch. Rosenfeld will be accompanied by the German-Islandic chamber music **Ensemble Adapter**, who are one of the most experimental and genrecrossing groups in New Music.

Douglas Gordon's practice encompasses video and film, installation, sculpture, photography and text. Through his work, Gordon investigates human conditions like memory and the passage of time, as well as universal dualities such as life and death, good and evil, right and wrong. 'Bound to Hurt' is a performance which crosses different media and which spans between different emotional states such as love and hate, tenderness and aggression.

The Basel premiere of 'Bound to Hurt' will be presented in collaboration with Art Basel.

'Bound to Hurt' is a collaboration with HAU (Hebbel am Ufer), Berlin, Internationales Sommerfestival Kampnagel, Hamburg and Theater Basel, supported by Hauptstadtkulturfonds, Berlin.

About Douglas Gordon

Douglas Gordon was born in Glasgow in 1966. After receiving a BA at the Glasgow School of Art from in 1988, Gordon undertook a post-graduate program at the Slade School of Art in London from 1988 to 1990. Gordon's oeuvre has been exhibited globally and his film works have been presented at many competitions, including the Festival de Cannes, the Toronto International Film Festival, and the International Venice Film Festival. He was the recipient of the 1996 Turner Prize, the 1997 Venice Biennial's Premio 2000 award, the 1998 Hugo Boss Prize awarded by the Solomon R. Guggenheim Museum, the 2008 Roswitha Haftmann Prize, and the 2012 Käthe Kollwitz Prize.

Douglas Gordon is represented internationally by Gagosian Gallery, by Galerie Eva Presenhuber in Zürich, Dvir Gallery in Tel Aviv and by Until Then in Paris.

About Philip Venables

British composer Philip Venables' music addresses violence and sexuality, in both a concert and interdisciplinary context. He has a special interest for spoken word in a musical setting.

About Ensemble Adapter

Ensemble Adapter is a German-Icelandic ensemble for contemporary music based in Berlin. The core of the group consists of a quartet with flute, clarinet, harp and percussion. Together with steady guest instrumentalists the ensemble grows into chamber music settings with up to 10 players.

About Theater Basel

Theater Basel is Switzerland's largest three-branch-theatre and offers a wide-ranging program in opera, ballet and drama. It has been awarded several times 'Theatre of the Year', 'Opera of the Year' and 'Chorus of the Year'. Around 600 performances of about 40 new productions can be seen each season from September to June on the theatre's three stages.
