# Institute of the 21st Century (i21c) @ ForYourArt with Hans Ulrich Obrist, July 30-31

i21c is a non-profit initiative established by Hans Ulrich Obrist and Bettina Korek, with Interview Project editor Karen Marta, to digitally archive the entirety of Obrist's Interview Project, which is an extensive collection of thousands of interviews conducted by Obrist with leading members of the art, science, and technology communities. Past projects with i21c include Hans Ulrich Obrist's installation at the 2011 Architecture Biennale in Venice, Italy, where he interviewed over 40 architects in the exhibition, and the recent co-publication of the Walther Koenig *Conversation Series* with Jeff Koons and Hans Ulrich Obrist. The Institute of the 21st Century is a project of the Pasadena Arts Council's EMERGE Fiscal Sponsor Program and will pop up in Los Angeles at ForYourArt July 30-31. Details to follow.

### The Planter Show, September 6-9

ForYourArt *hosts The Planter Show* on September 6–9 to coincide with the opening of Ken Price at LACMA the following weekend. *The Planter Show* takes the form of a flowerpot as a starting point to consider the sculptural, functional, and cultural implications of putting plants into containers. In the last few years, an increasing number of artists have made planters, created standalone sculptures that include plants, or included potted plants in installations. Building on this, *The Planter Show* will include numerous works by emerging and established artists from Los Angeles, ranging from straightforward pots with holes in the bottom to sculptures that reconsider the hybrid outdoor-indoor space created by a plant in a portable container. The three-day show will also include terrariums, free ready-to-plant cuttings, a container gardening 'zine, and a plant-related workshop.

### 24 Hour Donut City II: LACMA's Choice, September 22-23

ForYourArt at 6020 Wilshire Blvd will reprise its successful opening event, *24 Hour Donut City*, from September 22-23 to coincide with the screening of Christian Marclay's *The Clock* at LACMA. This iteration, *24 Hour Donut City II: LACMA's Choice* will provide visitors another opportunity to sample LACMA's favorite donuts and

new essays about *The Clock* by Ed Schad and Andrew Berardini.
