Smithsonian's National Portrait Gallery Inaugural American Portrait Gala Nov. 15

WHAT

This November, the Smithsonian's National Portrait Gallery will hold the inaugural American Portrait Gala. The black-tie affair celebrates America's icons and the art of portraiture and honors five Americans from the worlds of athletics, fashion, the arts, entertainment and military service. All proceeds from the American Portrait Gala will be used to establish the National Portrait Gallery's first-ever endowment for exhibitions.

Bringing together philanthropists, artists, tastemakers and luminaries, the evening will begin with a cocktail reception in the historic building where President Abraham Lincoln held his second inaugural ball. Attendees will dine in the museum's elegant Kogod Courtyard beneath the acclaimed Foster + Partners undulating glass-roof canopy. As dinner is served, guests will enjoy the inaugural presentation of the Portrait of a Nation Prize, recognizing exemplary achievement in their fields. Actor/filmmaker Lee Daniels will present the Portrait of a Nation Prize to Carolina Herrera, General Joseph Dunford to Cpl. Kyle Carpenter, the Honorable Congressman John Lewis to Hank Aaron, a distinguished guest (name to be announced) to Aretha Franklin, and architect David Adjaye to Maya Lin. The evening will culminate with dessert and musical performance. Masters of Ceremonies will be PBS NewsHour's co-anchors and managing editors Gwen Ifill and Judy Woodruff.
