Mitchell-Innes & Nash Represents Mary Kelly



NEW YORK, March 22, 2016 - Mitchell-Innes & Nash announces the representation of LA-based artist Mary Kelly.

Mary Kelly's practice spans over four decades and encompasses ideas about the body, systems of classification and power, memory and history. Her large-scale, narrative installations have been central to discussions of Conceptual Art and feminism since the 1970s, and her writings have been requisite to the discourse of postmodernism.

Kelly's projects are expansive in both time and space. Her seminal series, *Post-Partum Document* (1973-79), infamously featured her son's

stained diaper liners together with printed details of his diet, as well as statistical tables, diagrams, and diary excerpts. The document was a six-year exploration of the mother-child relationship and the meaning of "women's work". Later pieces, such as *Gloria Patri* (1992), focused on masculinity and the role of women in the military. Using components of etched and polished aluminum, the installation called attention to the spectacle of war in Iraq in the early 1990s, and the way it affected everyday life at that time. *Love Songs* (2005-07), an intergenerational reflection on feminism, was presented at Documenta 12. The five-part work included a Happening with one hundred women wearing flashing bicycle lights on their nipples and crotches.

Her current project, *Circa Trilogy*, which continues the exploration of generational and historical themes, has been undertaken with the support of a 2015 John Simon Guggenheim Memorial Fellowship. Kelly will have her first solo show with the gallery in the fall of 2017.
