

# HONORARY KNIGHTHOOD AWARDED TO MOHAMMED ABOUL LATIF JAMEEL

**RIYADH/ NEW YORK** (November 5, 2014) – **Mohammed Abdul Latif Jameel** has been awarded an Honorary Knighthood in the Most Excellent Order of the British Empire Her Majesty The Queen for his philanthropic activities and support for the development of the arts and culture in the UK.

Mr. Jameel, a businessman and noted philanthropist, is chairman of Abdul Latif Jameel Community Initiatives (ALJCI), which is dedicated to social and economic sustainability in the Middle East and beyond. Recognized for his international support for the development of the arts and culture, Mr. Jameel has played a significant part in a project to restore the Islamic Gallery housed in the Victoria & Albert Museum in London.

Through its cultural initiative, **Art Jameel**, ALJCI founded the Jameel Prize in partnership with the Victoria & Albert Museum. Art Jameel aims to foster and promote a thriving arts scene within the MENAT region and to support the development of creative enterprises. Art Jameel is also the founding partner of a number of initiatives such as Jeddah Art Week, The Crossway Foundation and Edge of Arabia. Art Jameel continues to partner with these and other art organizations.

Mohammed Abdul Latif Jameel said: "I am deeply humbled that Her Majesty The Queen would see fit to bestow this honor upon me. This award is a great honor for my family and me, and also reflects the hard work and support of the hundreds of ALJCI team members who run the numerous programs that help make such a difference. I would also like to thank the many partners that we work with across the globe, including MIT, and particularly the Victoria & Albert Museum for their support in preserving and promoting Islamic arts and culture."

Honorary knighthoods are awarded by the Queen, on the advice of the Foreign Secretary, to those who have made an important contribution to British interests. Mohammed Abdul Latif Jameel is the first Saudi businessman to been conferred this honor.
