WHAT:

For the first time, the Parrish Art Museum's annual Midsummer Party was held in its new home in Water Mill, NY, which opened to the public on November 10, 2012. Located on fourteen acres, the 34,400-square-foot, Herzog & de Meuron-designed building is the first art museum built on the East End of Long Island in more than a century and the cultural centerpiece and most recognizable architectural landmark in the region.

Alice Aycock Drawings: Some Stories Are Worth Repeating (closed July 13) The first comprehensive exploration of Alice Aycock's drawings, a vital aspect of the renowned sculptor's creative process.

Platform: Josephine Meckseper (through October 14) Sculptural works installed in the outdoor gallery, lobby, and permanent collection galleries respond to the Museum's architecture and collection.

The first-ever installation of the Permanent Collection (ongoing) The collection features more than 2,700 works ranging from the nineteenth century to the present, a portion of which is on view for the first time in the Museum's 115-year history, ranging from masterworks by American Impressionist William Merritt Chase and post-war American realist Fairfield Porter, to work by prominent contemporary artists.
