

An Evening of Perpetual Motion and Haute Couture

Performance re-envisioned by contemporary artist Ryan McNamara starring surprise well-known arts patron, aerial acrobats, 12-piece live orchestra, original Satie score, historic screening of Entr'acte, and more

WHAT: On Thursday, November 29, 2012, more than 500 guests will gather in black and white *haute couture* at the industrial chic Stage 37 for an elegant celebration inspired by the original *Relâche* performance co-organized by **Francis Picabia** and **Erik Satie** in Paris in 1924. Re-envisioned by contemporary artist **Ryan McNamara** as the "Francis Picabia" of the evening, Performa's *Relâche – The Party* will provide a multi-sensorial experience showcasing the beauty and significance of the Surrealist movement alongside contributions by artists of today. The first of many in the coming year, *Relâche – The Party* will precede **Performa 13**, the fifth edition of the international biennial of new visual art performance taking place throughout New York City from November 1-24, 2013.

Guests entering for cocktails will be greeted by **live musicians** performing **excerpts of Satie's famed compositions** to sneak peeks of the **original film** *Entr'acte* before exploring the costuming station offerings of **fashion designer Lika Volkova**, a **communal exquisite corpse**, and a time machine photo booth. Featuring a Dali inspired menu, the dinner program will include a re-envisioning of the performance that never was, but then was, but then never was again by contemporary artist **Ryan McNamara** titled **Re: Re: Re: Relâche.** Art historian and curator **Milly Glimcher** will be honored for her early 2012 Pace Gallery, New York exhibition *Happenings:* New York, 1958–1963, while **Dr. Todd Colby** will pay tribute to Francis Picabia and Erik Satie. A **live auction** will provide guests the opportunity to bid on a performance by internationally acclaimed Thai artist **Rirkrit Tiravanija** and Producers credits for Performa 13 Commissions by New York artists **Ryan McNamara**, **Adam Pendleton**, **Marianne Vitale**, and a Performa 11 edition video by **Liz Magic Laser. DJ Pierce Jackson** will provide beats for the desserts and dancing portion of the evening, where the Surrealist twists and a finale performance by hit pop singer and songwriter **Sia** with piano accompaniment by **Barney McAII** will end the night. Guests will be treated to Sia songs **Breathe Me** from the album **Colour The Small One** (2004 Universal International; written by Sia Furler and Dan Carey) and **Soon We'll Be Found** from the album **some people have REAL problems** (2008 Monkey Puzzle Music; written by Sia Furler and Rick Nowels).

Founded in 2004 by art historian and curator RoseLee Goldberg, **Performa** is the leading international organization dedicated to exploring the critical role of live visual art performance in the history of the twentieth century and to generating new directions for the twenty-first century. Performa's unique commissioning, touring, and year-round education programs culminate in the Performa biennial every other November. In 2005, Performa launched the first-ever biennial dedicated to visual art performance, Performa 05, which was then followed by Performa 07 (2007), Performa 09 (2009), and Performa 11 (2011). Performa will present its fifth biennial, Performa 13, in November 2013. The Performa Institute, a platform for the research and educational components of Performa, presents lectures, panel discussions and workshops on an ongoing basis.
