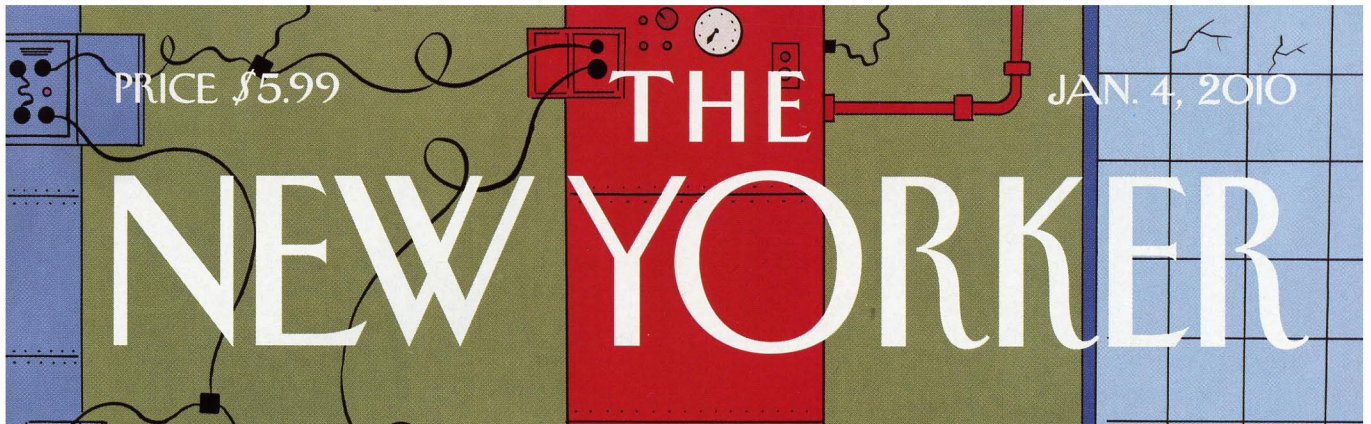

It's a slight conceit, but a charming one: take a random sampling of New York galleries—from Castelli, in the sixties, to Nosei, in the eighties, to Reena Spaulings, in the aughts—and draw them as islands, in a maplike palette of pink, yellow, and green. Mark with artists' names in lieu of cities', then install on the wall in an archipelago-like cluster.
