## Gallery Shows--Warhol Soup Cans

**L&M Arts** in Manhattan is currently displaying 12 paintings from Andy Warhol's series of *Colored Campbell's Soup Cans*. In 1965, Warhol created the iconic Tomato Soup can in 20 color combinations, such as orange, purple, and kelly green as well as tan, blue, and red. In doing so he made each of these large-format, silkscreened paintings its own aesthetic and classic Warhol style.

In the nearly half-century since their creation, this series of paintings has never been the exclusive subject of an exhibition. The gallery thanked the private and institutional lenders, including the Menil Collection and the Milwaukee Art Museum, for their support.

To accompany the exhibition, L&M Arts has published a fully illustrated catalog that features all 20 paintings in the series as well as an essay by renowned Warhol scholar Rainer Crone and his co author Wouter Wirth.
