

Volunteers Needed for New Interpretive program at Tallman Mountain State Park

Do you have a love of nature? Do you want share your knowledge of the outdoors? Do you have some spare time to do some field work? Tallman Mountain, a 706 acre state park in Piermont, NY, is looking for people just like you to help create a new interpretive program. Volunteers are needed to identify and track trees, vegetation species and areas of interest along the Route 9W bike path. Once this is done, educational markers will be placed along the path. With your help, we plan on starting this spring and completing the project in the fall.

Tallman Mountain State Park comprises wooded country on the easterly slope of the Palisades uplands overlooking the Hudson and Piermont Marsh, which lies between the river and the slope. The marsh is part of the Hudson River National Estuarine Research Reserve. The park operates as a day-use area, offering a running track, tennis courts, playfield, cross country skiing, a walking trail, hiking and picnic areas.
