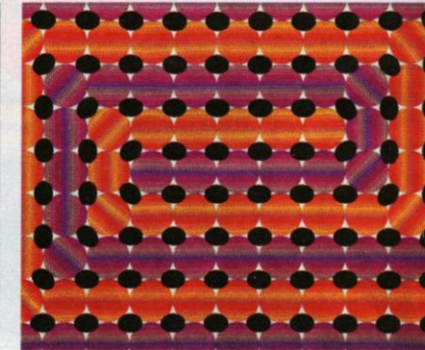
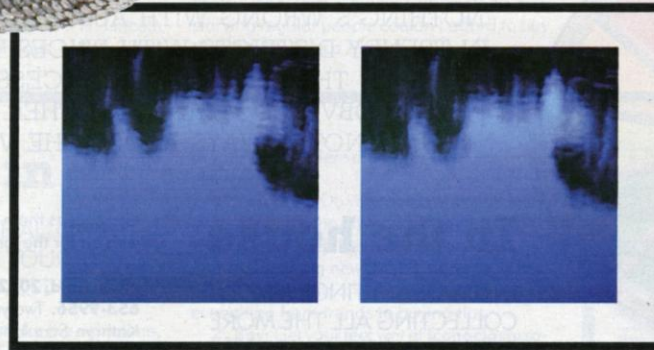




New York artist Marc Swanson is known for sculptures and installations at once autobiographical and melancholic.
