In her choice of art, as well as furniture and furnishings, Rose Uniacke never strays from her disciplined colour scheme. **Alex Schneideman** (tel: 020-8964 9875; www.schneideman.com) specialises in photography for interiors and has an extensive portfolio of ready-to-print images. Prices start from around £200 for a 40 x 50cm framed image. Alex will happily come to your house to advise and, should you want to commission your own series of photographs, he will 'shoot to order' for free - providing, that is, he is inspired by the subject matter and that you allow him to add the images to his portfolio.

2 SOURCE: PARQUET

Rose's oak parquet floor started life in County Hall, London - she bought it at **LASSCO** (tel: 020-7394 2100; www.lassco.co.uk). Currently, the company is selling reclaimed oak parquet (pictured) from the Home Office. Expect to pay £35 a square metre, sold 'as is'. LASSCO will recommend fitters should you need them.

3 DESIGN NOTE: WARDROBE DOORS

Rose's upholstered wardrobe doors are sleek and modern - worlds away from the more usual, country-house, chintzy, padded version. The doors, for a start, are exaggeratedly tall and narrow, and open to reveal raw, untreated oak within. The fabric, a painted linen from Abbott & Boyd (now discontinued), was applied directly to the doors, without any padding. Curtain specialist **Jon Rhodes** (tel: 01263-731888) would be able to do something similar.

4 SPOTTED: TAPS

This is the 'Minimal' tap, £1,220, designed by G Gianturco for Boffi, and available at **Alternative Plans** (tel: 020-7228 6460; www.alternative-plans.co.uk).
